CAMP
scholarship

“When all else fails...” What happens when a storm or other natural disaster takes out critical communications infrastructure? We've seen it happen from hurricanes in Puerto Rico to wildfires in California...when critical communications fail, where do we turn? Amateur radio operators (HAMS) say, “When all else fails...ham radio!”

The public is invited to see that emergency preparedness in action **Saturday and Sunday, June 26 & 27**, as local area ham radio operators practice that skill in a 24-hour drill called Field Day. Every June, more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation. It combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event. Field Day has been an annual event since 1933, and remains the most popular event in ham radio.

Using technology as diverse as computer-to-computer radio communications, satellites in orbit built by hams, ham radio equipment based on the International Space Station, as well as traditional “old school” radio gear, our local group will be attempting to make as many contacts with other Field Day hams as possible. All this is done “off the grid”, using gasoline generators for electricity, simulating emergency conditions. The goal is fun...but it's also to sharpen our skills should they be needed.

Interested? Stop by our field day site, **Good News Baptist Church parking lot**, 145919 Lowland Lane, Mosinee. And bring the kids – ham radio is a great STEM activity. Radios will be in operation from 1:00 pm Saturday to 1:00 pm Sunday, and you can pick up information on how to get started in this world-spanning hobby.
